PRE-ENCOUNTER SESSIONS

Introduction

Welcome to the Encounter Weekend. Thank you for taking the time and making the effort to be here. You will be glad you did!

We have set aside this special weekend for you to have an encounter with God. We believe that when a person encounters God, he or she will encounter change. Hundreds of people have attended these dynamic seminars and have walked away with tremendous testimonies of how God has transformed their lives.

Many people struggle with issues in the past, which affect their daily lives and relationship with God and others. As you open up your soul, you will learn how to break free from past issues and discover the joy of walking in the fullness of God's plan for your life.

IMPORTANT:

To receive the maximum benefit of an Encounter, a person must be able to be open and transparent before God and before others. This is a critical aspect of the retreat. Because of the nature of ministry during this weekend, complete confidentiality must be agreed upon during all ministry and small group times. What is spoken during ministry or in your small group remains there and goes no further.

The standard of openness and transparency that must be established is a high one, but the Bible gives us many illustrations for encouragement. See the following examples:

Jesus Christ – [Matthew 26:36-39]

Mary Magdalene – [Mark 16:9]

The Gerasene demoniac – [Mark 5:1-19]

Don't be afraid to let God work in you and through you. Remember, He knows everything and wants the best for His children. You will receive from Him to the same degree you are open to Him.

Be blessed this weekend and expect God to do something awesome in you as you encounter Him!

What is an Encounter?

An Encounter Weekend is a dramatic experience that completely changes the course of our lives. All of us have already experienced many important milestones, or encounters, in our lives: falling in love and perhaps getting married, being accepted into a university, obtaining a job, etc... But of all the encounters we could have, the most important one is an encounter with the living God! Matthew 16:26 says, *What good will it be for a man if he gains the whole world, yet forfeits his soul?*”(NIV).

The Encounter Weekend presents a series of experiences and personal teachings that result in visible manifested change in the lives of all who participate. It offers people an environment and opportunity that allows them to discover how to establish their relationship with God, how to have direct fellowship with Him, and how to commit to His Lordship in their lives. Participants are given the opportunity to know and accept Jesus, if they have not previously done so. They are taught the claims of the Gospel and experience forgiveness of sin, deliverance from bondage, emotional and physical healing, and restoration of worth and value. They also learn how to walk in the blessings of a covenant relationship with God and His family.

Being a Christian means to live by God’s Word – learning it, personally experiencing it, and obeying it. The Bible gives us many examples of people who did just that and were radically transformed by their personal encounters with the Lord Jesus. The Samaritan woman (John 4:5-29), Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-10), the Gadarene demoniac (Matthew 8:28-34), and all the disciples of Christ were never the same again after encountering Jesus. Consequently, we can be assured that when we, too, have an encounter with him, we will never be the same.

It is our desire and prayer that every person here this weekend seizes the opportunity to experience God. The results will be manifested in transformed lives – lives that are saved, forgiven of sin, set free, and healed by the power of the living God, Jesus Christ the Lord.

Objectives for the Encounter

1. To assure that each participant knows and accepts Jesus Christ as his or her own personal Lord and Savior.
2. To make known the claims of the Gospel and for each participant to experience personal forgiveness of sin issues, deliverance, healing, and prosperity.
3. To motivate the participant to develop a personal relationship with the Father, the Son Jesus, and the Holy Spirit and to help him or her grow in the knowledge of God's Word.
4. To experience a fresh visitation of the Cross of Christ and to witness its power to regenerate every issue a believer may experience.
5. To understand the power of the Holy Spirit as he works in the personal life of each participant and to set a process through which that participant can continually walk in freedom and overcome every obstacle.
6. To encourage each participant to give witness to the work of God in his or her life at home, at work, at school, etc... in order to win souls.
7. To clarify the vision of the church – win, integrate, disciple, identify, and send – by motivating each person to continue in a walk of freedom and to begin training in the School of Leaders.
8. To experience God in an extreme and revolutionary way.

Pre-Encounter Student Notes

- **OPENING:** [Matthew 16:26 - NIV] *26 What good will it be for a man if he gains the whole world, yet forfeits his soul? Or what can a man give in exchange for his soul?*

- **PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE ENCOUNTER WEEKEND:**
 1. To assure that each participant knows and accepts Jesus Christ as his or her own personal Lord and Savior.
 2. To make known the claims of the Gospel and for each participant to experience personal forgiveness of sin issues, deliverance, healing, and prosperity.
 3. To motivate the participant to develop a personal relationship with the Father, the Son Jesus, and the Holy Spirit and to help him or her grow in the knowledge of God's Word.
 4. To experience a fresh visitation of the Cross of Christ and to witness its power to regenerate every issue a believer may experience.
 5. To understand the power of the Holy Spirit as he works in the personal life of each participant and to set a process through which that participant can continually walk in freedom and overcome every obstacle.
 6. To encourage each participant to give witness to the work of God in his or her life at home, at work, at school, etc... in order to win souls.
 7. To clarify the vision of the church – win, integrate, disciple, identify, and send – by motivating each person to continue in a walk of freedom and to begin training in the School of Leaders.
 8. To experience God in an extreme and revolutionary way.

- **IN PREPARATION – participants should apply the following:**
 1. Focus on God through daily worship and prayer each day between now and the beginning of the weekend.
 2. Think through root issues, stumbling blocks, habits, or walls that may be hindering you in your walk with God.
 3. Plan a three-day partial fast Monday – Wednesday of your encounter week (just preceding the actual encounter weekend).
 - * There is no need to be legalistic about fasting. What individuals do will vary from person to person. The emphasis is on devoting ourselves to preparation for the encounter weekend as the Holy Spirit leads. We recommend fasting breakfast and lunch followed by a light dinner on these three days.
 4. Prepare your heart and mind by reading the assigned scriptures each day between now and the encounter retreat.
 5. Keep a journal during the pre-encounter weeks and the encounter weekend to record your experience and things the Lord will speak to you. This will play an important role in your testimony in days to come.

Pre-Encounter Lesson 1:

Introduction:

Most people encounter weariness, defeat, frustration, and shame in some area of their lives. There can actually seem to be an unseen hand holding them to a course they feel incapable of changing.

If you have accepted Jesus Christ into your life or even if you know God has provided a way for you to walk in His light, yet you continue to grow weary or walk in defeat, you are among the majority of Christian people today.

I. Three Reasons for Defeat [1 John 3:8] *For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might destroy the works of the devil.*

- A. Many people deny the existence of the spiritual realm or have a lack of knowledge about how it operates.
- B. Many people have simply “bought into” a lie of the enemy.
- C. Compromise with the enemy, even unknowingly, becomes a major cause of failure and results in deeper bondage.

II. Victory through Christ – The conflict in the universe centers on who will have authority – God or Satan. These two forces are always at work.

[Ephesians 2:4-6] 4 But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, 5 even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), 6 and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus.

- A. The Authority of God
- B. The Birth of the Conflict (see Genesis 3).
- C. God's Redemptive Plan
- D. The Conflict Won!
- E. Saints in the Light

III. The Roaring Lion Today – If Jesus defeated Satan, why is the earth covered with sin, violence, and injustice rather than love, joy, and peace. These are some of the reasons: [1 Peter 5:7-8] 8 Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour.

- A. Believers often walk in ignorance concerning their liberty in Christ.
- B. Satan is a sore loser.
- C. Satan uses doubt and despair in our minds and hearts to convince us that we are still somehow subject to his authority.
- D. We must step into our on – the – job training to overcome!

Conclusion:

CHRIST'S VICTORY IS FOR US! Christ didn't conquer Satan for Himself. His entire sacrificial work at Calvary was for us. As a result, our identification in Christ's death sets us free from sin, self, the Law, the world, and Satan!

Sins: [1 Corinthians 15:3]

3 For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures...

Self: [Galatians 2:20]

20 I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me.

The Law: [Romans 7:6]

6 But now we have been delivered from the law, having died to what we were held by, so that we should serve in the newness of the Spirit and not in the oldness of the letter.

The World: [Galatians 6:14]

14 But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world.

Satan: [1 John 4:4]

4 You are of God, little children, and have overcome them, because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world.

Pre-Encounter Lesson 2:

INTRODUCTION: The schemes of the demonic realm do affect your life. It's time to sharpen your spiritual sight and realize there is more in this life than what can be seen! For example, if you are Christian, chances are you have experienced an attack or a temptation from Satan. In your heart, you knew what was happening, but you may not have understood how to deal with it or withstand it.

Be encouraged! You are not required to fight a blind match for which there are no rules! There are spiritual laws that operate in the universe, and Satan himself must play by these rules. All of us have experienced Satan's attacks in our lives, but we can learn his devious ways and withstand these attacks.

II. Five Strategies of Satan [Ephesians 4:27 KJV] *Neither give place to the devil.*

- A. Strategy 1: Lies and Deception [John 8:44] ... *He (the devil) was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own resources, for he is a liar and the father of it.*
 - 1. The devil cannot tell the truth
 - 2. The devil is a master deceiver
- B. Strategy 2: Accusations and Condemnation [Revelation 12:10] ... *"Now salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of His Christ have come, for the accuser of our brethren, who accused them before our God day and night, has been cast down.*
- C. Strategy 3: Doubt, Unbelief, and Fear [Psalm 27:1] *The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The LORD is the strength of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?*
 - 1. Don't let doubt attack your mind
 - 2. Fear is the opposite of faith
- D. Strategy 4: The battle of the mind [2 Corinthians 10:5] ... *casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ.*
 - 1. Everything you do begins in your thoughts
 - 2. If you have inappropriate or evil thoughts, don't get worried. You haven't sinned

- E. Strategy 5: Attacking the Word of God [Psalm 119:11] *Your word I have hidden in my heart, that I might not sin against You!*
1. Satan tried to use God's Word to tempt and ensnare Jesus, but Jesus continually replied back "It is written..."
 2. As a believer, you are equipped to handle the devil's intrusion in your life
 3. Avoid arrogance where Satan is concerned
- III. Five Open Doors – There are five doors that invite darkness into our lives. If one or more of these doors is open, Satan has ground to operate in your life. These doors create hooks or handles in your soul that difficulties, stumbling blocks, and demonic forces can attach themselves to.
- A. Disobedience [Romans 6:16] *Do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin leading to death, or of obedience leading to righteousness?*
- B. Unforgiveness [Matthew 6:14-15] *14 For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. 15 But if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.*
1. Unforgiveness is the refusal to let go of or excuse a debt owed by another person – regardless of how wrong or indebted that other person may be.
 2. Forgiveness is a supernatural ability given to you by God. It is almost impossible to walk in forgiveness outside of a relationship with Jesus.
 3. It is important to understand these three factors about forgiveness:
 - a. Forgiveness must come from the heart
 - b. Forgiveness is not an option
 - c. Forgiveness is not forgetting
 4. Forgiveness is not always easy
- C. Emotional Trauma [Luke 4:18] *18 The Spirit of the LORD is upon Me, because He has anointed Me to preach the gospel to the poor; He has sent Me to*

heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed...

1. Emotional trauma is inner wounds caused by sudden physical injury or emotional shock.
 2. There are two kinds of Emotional trauma or wounds:
 - a. Wounds that we had a part in causing
 - b. Wounds that we had no part in causing
 3. Although different people are affected by their experiences in different ways, healing must come.
- D.** Inner Vows and Judgments [Matthew 7:1-2] *1 Judge not, that you be not judged. 2 For with what judgment you judge, you will be judged; and with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you.*
- E.** Curses [Proverbs 26:2] *Like a flitting sparrow, like a flying swallow, so a curse without cause shall not alight.*
1. A curse can be compared to an extended, evil rope with one end tied to you and the other end attached to “who knows what” in the unseen past.
 2. Symptoms of a curse will leave a person feeling frustrated and disappointed
 3. Curses can be transmitted through words or physical objects
 4. Seven common evidences of a curse:
 - a. Insanity, personality, and emotional disturbances
 - b. Hereditary afflictions, chronic illnesses
 - c. Difficulties with conception, pregnancy, and other female problems
 - d. Divorce and division in family relationships
 - e. Persistent financial shortage
 - f. Being accident – prone
 - g. Suicide or unnatural, premature, or violent deaths
 5. Once curses are broken, a person must remain under authority at home, work, and especially church to stay protected and safe.

- IV. Three Steps to the Place of Victory and Deliverance – If Jesus has defeated Satan, and then we too have His authority to enforce the victory of the cross.
- A.** Confess your faith in Jesus and make Him your Lord
 - B.** Yield yourself completely to God, and depend totally on Him and His power to free you.
 - C.** Take away Satan’s legal ground by closing any open doors.

Conclusion: PREPARE FOR VICTORY!

- As we close this session and prepare to go to the encounter weekend. Let your life be marked with praise.
- Praise celebrates God and irritates Satan. God alone is worthy. His Son has made you free.

READ PSALM 34

Pre-Encounter Homework

Homework Instructions:

We ask that you take this Encounter Experience and the preparation for it very seriously. Your life, spiritual development, and relationship with God can be dramatically and powerfully affected in the next two weeks. Please stay focused during this time and don't allow the enemy to distract you or deter you during this time. We also ask that you do each homework assignment on the day it is assigned exactly as it is laid out on this syllabus.

Each homework assignment should require approximately fifteen to twenty minutes of your time, not including your personal prayer time. Find a quiet place with few distractions to do your reading and prayer for the next two weeks. Expect God to speak to you.

Each day, your homework will be centered on the comparison of Satan's lies with God's truth. You should read the comparisons with their accompanying scriptures then pray for God to open your understanding concerning any areas in your heart where He wants access. Read the "Strategy for Today" and write down a way you can apply that strategy in your life. Spend some personal time in prayer, asking God to meet with you in a transforming way in the upcoming weekend.
